Commissary Corner

D's Vegan Chili (2004)

1 ½ tsp. Oregano
¾ tsp. Cilantro
½ Whole Coriander
1/8tsp. ground Coriander
1/8 tsp. Paprika
3/8 tsp. Cumin seed
1/8 Ground Cumin.
3/8 tsp. Chili Powder
3/8 tsp. Chili Con Carne Seasoning (Mexican Style Chili Seasoning)
1/8 tsp. Ground Cinnamon.

2 Green Peppers (cut to approx. 1 ½ x ¼ slices)
1 Large Onion (cut to approx. 1 ½ x ¼ slices)
8 Jalapeno's & 1 Chipotle Pepper, sliced thin
20 Cloves garlic, chopped
2/3 Lime (washed, sliced thin, chopped)

Commissary Corner

Orange Glazed Salmon

3 tsp Cajun seasoning (salt free)
1 tsp brown sugar
1/4 tsp kosher salt
4 boneless, skinless salmon fillets
2 tsp vegetable oil
1/4 cup Seville orange marmalade
1tbsp lime juice
lime wedges

Combine: Cajun seasoning, sugar and salt in a small bowl. Rub over all surfaces of the fillets
Sauté: fillets in oil in a large non-stick skillet over medium high heat for 3-4 minutes. Turn and sauté an additional 2-3 minutes

Blend: Marmalade and lime juice; swirl in skillet until melted. Carefully turn fish to glaze on all sides. The salmon is done when it begins to flake when tested with a fork.

Serve: with lime wedges

(Sautee Veg's above slightly in a bit of Extra Virgin Olive Oil)

1 Can Each: Goya Refried Traditional & Refried Black, Ranchero, Red Beans in Chili Sauce, Dark Red Kidney, Small White Beans, Pinto Beans, Pink Beans, Black Beans,

1 Jar White Corn & Black Bean Salsa (Muir Glen Organic)

1 Package Each: Tex-Mex Chili Seasoning, Hot Chili Seasoning, Original Chili Seasoning.

1 Tbsp. Lime Juice

1 Tbsp. Cayenne Pepper Sauce, (or 1/4 tsp. Cayenne Pepper.) Or Favorite Hot Sauce.

2 Cans Crushed Tomatoes in Puree.

Once you've sautéed the Veg's, add the Herbs, stir, add the rest of the ingredients, Heat thoroughly.

Make Cornbread with 1/2 can chopped green chilies, jalapeno & walnuts. Serve with Honey-Butter. Have on the side – Sour Cream, Black Olives, Lime Wedges, Cabot Chipotle Cheddar, Lime and Garlic Salsa, Herr's Salsa and Lime Chips, and Bite Sized Durangos.
