Commissary Corner

Chicken Creole This can be done on a 2 burner camp stove or a 12 inch Dutch oven

Prep Time 40 min

Ingredients:

4 chicken breasts, cut into strips

1 can tomato sauce

1 can diced tomatoes

1 green pepper, chopped

1 small onion, chopped

1 stalk of celery, chopped

1 tablespoon chili powder

1 teaspoon sweet basil

1/4 quarter teaspoon dried minced garlic

1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper

salt & pepper to taste

Prep: Cook chicken breast strips in a hot lightly oiled skillet for a few minutes, until they are no longer pink. Reduce heat and add the remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil, stir occasionally. Reduce heat, cover and simmer for 10-15 minutes. Serve over rice which you can prepare sat the same time on the other burner. Add crusty French bread for a real treat

Serves 4-6 so adjust ingredients for size of group
