

As those of you who attend the L.E.C. and Lodge meetings are already aware, there had been a small problem in the printing process. The original process called for plastic laminated cards. At the present time, we are hoping to finalize plans to be able to offer you "credit card" quality cards. The committee appreciates your patience and understanding. The end result should be a card that will last for years. If you requested a card, and you want to check on its status, you can contact Neil Levinsky, Membership Advisor, at Levinsky@myTalk.com. or come to an LEC or Lodge meeting.

In other news, the LEC recommended a dues increase from \$5.00 to \$8.00 in February, and the Lodge voted in favor of the motion at the March meeting. Effective immediately, the 2000 dues are \$8.00. If you are in arrears for more than this year, you must pay one year's back dues (\$5.00) in addition to this year's \$8.00 dues for a total of \$13.00.

If there is an error on your mailing label, or you know someone who is not getting his or her mailings, let us know. Since most of our mailings are sent via Bulk Rate, we do not get back undelivered mail. We're counting on you to help us!

A final reminder about membership cards... If you paid your dues by mail and want us to mail your card, you must enclose a stamped self-addressed envelope. New cards are also issued at LEC, Lodge meetings and most OA events.
